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Contractor-Proven Review Before You Sign
When to Use This: The final walkthrough is your last opportunity to verify that the home is complete, functional and built as promised—before signing closing documents.
Important: Do not rush this step. Once you close, your leverage drops significantly.
Overall Condition
 ☐ Home clean and free of construction debris ☐ No visible damage to walls, ceilings, floors, or finishes ☐ All agreed-upon changes completed ☐ All punch list items corrected ☐ No unfinished or incomplete work
Doors & Windows
 □ All doors open, close, and latch properly □ Door hardware secure and functioning □ Windows open, close, and lock smoothly □ Screens installed where applicable □ Weatherstripping intact
Electrical & Lighting
 □ All outlets and switches operational □ GFCI and AFCI outlets tested □ Light fixtures installed and functioning □ Ceiling fans operating properly □ Exterior lights functioning

Plumbing & Fixtures
 □ Toilets flush properly □ Faucets operate with correct hot/cold orientation □ No leaks under sinks or at fixtures □ Showers and tubs drain properly □ Water pressure consistent throughout the home
HVAC & Systems
 ☐ HVAC system operational ☐ Thermostat functioning correctly ☐ Supply and return vents unobstructed ☐ Bathroom exhaust fans operational ☐ No unusual noises from equipment
Appliances
 □ All appliances installed □ Appliances powered and operational □ Manufacturer manuals provided □ Serial numbers recorded
Safety Items
 ☐ Smoke detectors installed and tested ☐ Carbon monoxide detectors installed and tested ☐ Handrails secure where required ☐ Garage fire separation intact
Exterior (Final Confirmation)
 □ Exterior punch list items completed □ Grading complete and sloped away from foundation □ Gutters and downspouts installed □ Exterior doors sealed and secure
Closing Documentation
☐ Warranty documents received☐ Inspection approvals provided

 □ Builder contact information confirmed □ Emergency shutoffs located and explained

If something isn't complete at the final walkthrough, it must be documented in writing before closing—not promised verbally afterward.
